Rule 6. Time.

(a) Computation. In computing any period of time prescribed or allowed by these rules, by the local rules of any district court, by order of court, or by any applicable statutes, the day of the act, event, or default from which the designated period of time begins to run shall not be included. The last day of the period so computed shall be included, unless it is a Saturday, a Sunday, or a legal holiday, OR, WHEN THE ACT TO BE DONE IS THE FILING OF A PAPER, A DAY ON WHICH WEATHER OR OTHER CONDITIONS HAVE MADE THE OFFICE OF THE CLERK OF THE COURT INACCESSIBLE, in which event the period runs until the end of the next day which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or a legal holiday ONE OF THE AFOREMENTIONED DAYS. When the period of time prescribed or allowed is less than seven (7) ELEVEN (11) days, intermediate Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays shall be excluded in the computation. As used in this rule, "legal holiday" includes New Year's Day, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and any other day appointed as a holiday by the President or the Congress of the United States, or by the governor or legislature of the State of Wyoming ANY DAY OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZED AS A LEGAL HOLIDAY IN THIS STATE BY DESIGNATION OF THE LEGISLATURE OR APPOINTMENT AS A HOLIDAY BY THE GOVERNOR.


